"Greetings Beloved, I traveled to Afikpo yesterday, and I collected five boxes of tracts from Brother Reuben Egwu. This will be used for evangelism at Ihiala to help grow the new church."

In May, our MP container arrived in Cape Town, South Africa to our long time distributors, Rohan Jones and Paul Gerber. Rohan quickly had 430 boxes of MP

tracts trucked to Kaloma, Zambia for his annual mission work trips. Paul had a storage building built to hold his half of the container to distribute throughout South Africa and Botswana. Both men are excellent in spreading God's word.

Last month, our Liberia container arrived in Monrovia. Alfred Beyan, Director of the World Bible Institute Paynesville, received half of the load. He helped distribute some of the remaining material to Peter Makundu, Director of the Bear Valley Bible Institute (BVBI) in Kenema, Sierra Leon and some French material went on to a BVBI preaching school in the French country of Guinea. The BVBI in Ganta, is in the northeast of Liberia and received English material as well.

Mission Printing plans to ship the Cameroon container on Monday, Lord willing. That material is going to Elangwe Gregory of the BVBI Wotutu. Some French material will be supplied to the French BVBI in Mbanga, Cameroon and to another French speaking BVBI in Moundu, Chad. This adds another country to the distribution network of MP container materials.

The remaining 2003 shipments will be to Ghana, Kenya and Zimbabwe. We are on schedule to complete our goal of five ocean container shipments per year. Last year we had a challenge from a couple who gave us a large donation to fund a fifth container for 2002. This year the Lord has blessed us with another large donation from a California congregation and it will pay for a fifth container to spread "World Evangelism by the Printed Page". God continues to bless Mission Printing with the dedicated volunteers and the gospel loving donors. God knows best in all things. All glory to God!

Our prayers are for the families of two of our volunteers who passed away recently, Joe Shero (my brother-in-law) and Joey Alexander.

I thank you for your prayers and concern for my Pacemaker Procedure and things are progressing nicely. I plan to be back on the softball field next month.
